The CollabARTive also gives PPCS residents an opportunity to document their journeys from homelessness to independent living through different artistic mediums. The primary goal of the CollabARTive is to create group cohesion among residents of the transitional housing programs, as well as between residents and staff. Outside of CollabARTive meetings, Peter and Paul staff mostly interact with clients on a professional basis pushing them to build life skills. The CollabARTive art process, however, places PPCS residents and staff on the same level as they become art students, instructed by local artists in a variety of different art forms such as creative writing, dancing, drumming, sculpture, and painting.
