Online orders are completed through VitalChek, an official service authorized by the New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to securely order certified New York vital records, like birth certificates. Birth certificates will not be mailed to PO Box addresses.

You can also request a correction or a change to a birth certificate, check the status of your request, or order a Paternity Acknowledgement Form or a Letter of Exemplification.

Women with a substance abuse history enter a 28-day drug abuse program at Tuerk House upon their entrance into TAP, and then continue after-care treatment for another six months. Our TAP clients report to ADI at least three times a week for individual and group counseling, and depending on their personal situations, the women attend GED classes, and parenting and stress management classes. This pilot program seeks to provide a seamless, comprehensive network of services to ex-offenders to ensure their successful transition from prison to the community. The Bureau of Governmental Research, located at the University of Maryland, is conducting a 2-year multisite evaluation of the Reentry Partnership Initiative.

Community Impacts 900 Columbia University and Barnard College student volunteers serve low-income and unemployed residents in the Harlem, Washington Heights, and Morningside Heights communities. In addition 160 community members, including alumni, contribute to the volunteering. Volunteers can participate in 27 community service programs, ranging from youth education to emergency assistance for homeless families.
