Online orders are completed through VitalChek, an official service authorized by the New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to securely order certified New York vital records, like birth certificates. Birth certificates will not be mailed to PO Box addresses.

You can also request a correction or a change to a birth certificate, check the status of your request, or order a Paternity Acknowledgement Form or a Letter of Exemplification.
