Begun in 1988, the Veterans Re-Entry Program provides transitional housing for homeless Veterans having difficulties re-entering society because of post-traumatic stress syndrome or substance abuse or other problems. Funded under a contract with the Veterans Administration, and located at St. Francis Houses Elm Street location, the program provides a therapeutic setting for homeless Veterans, including the services of counseling, transitional housing, meals, laundry, and activities.
