A community reentry program for male former offenders recently released from prison. The program focuses on employability, combined with intensive supportive and therapeutic services. Over a 39 month period, up to 125 men and women, who beginning their reentry process while in a Hartford Work Release Program, are enrolled in trainings that lead to industry-recognized credentials required for in-demand careers. STARR Training to Work 2 (STARR T2W2)
T2W2 Program Eligibility Criteria: All eligible participants must be residing at a Department of Correction Work Release Program (WRP) in Hartford, CT at the time of enrollment and be within (9) months of their release date. All referrals for the program are generated directly from the staff at the local WRPs. Additional requirements set forth by DOL:
1. Is at least 18 years old on the date of enrollment;
2. Has been convicted as an adult and imprisoned under federal or state law but never been convicted of a sexual offense other than prostitution; and
3. Veterans Priority for Participants: The Jobs for Veterans Act (Public Law 107-288) requires grantees to provide priority of service for veterans and spouses of certain veterans for the receipt of employment, training, and placement services in any job training program directly funded, in whole or in part, by DOL.
